Message from Terry Fielder - Executive Director

I really cannot remember his face except that the sun and the sea had aged him. His eyes were dark and sharp. His nature was peaceful. Life was hard. He was poor. He was a fisherman and shared ownership of a small outrigger canoe -his "boat". He would go out on the sea beyond sight of land. He knew where fish could be found. He was amazing.

But it was what he said that I remember most clearly. As we talked about life, I asked him what being poor meant. His reply "My poverty means I have no choice". He could hardly read yet he had this gem of wisdom to share. I then asked, "How does the village credit project help you?" I knew he had a loan with which he had purchased a small lawn-mower type engine for his "boat". He said "My children can now go to school. They will have more choices than I have."

World Accord made it possible for him to help his family. We used some of your donations and a grant from the Canadian people (through CIDA) to support dozens of community programs all over the Philippines. This was the last year our Government supported that Program.

For Central America, World Accord worked with CIDA for several months on a 32 month Program Agreement through until April, 2007. Scandals over government spending have caused all departments, including CIDA, to become more demanding in project proposals and reporting all of which requires more time and effort from World Accord and our Partners.

The loss of options to access large Canadian Government grants is changing the program landscape for World Accord. World Accord continues to provide funding to long term Programs to help people help themselves. The development goal is "choice". Honduras, Guatemala and El Salvador in Central America, the CORDI Women's Program and Shelter in India and SAP Nepal in Asia. We want to do more. We need to do more.

2004 was a small budget year. We are not satisfied at this level. World Accord remembers the values that gave birth to the agency and after 24 years, we have learned about poverty, people and development. World Accord certainly is not poor because we still have choices. We live in a wealthy land. We have choices.

World Accord is your agency. As you choose to be a donor, you assure World Accord's present and future. This world we share needs the vision of world accord and you make it possible.

World Accord Construction Expeditions

Construction Expeditions are a volunteer led activity. Participants raise money to travel to one of our project areas in Central America and help local people with a building project. The benefits of these expeditions are far reaching. The local poor will get a house, school or water system. The participants get to help and in the process learn of the issues facing our partners and have the opportunity to develop kinship bonds with many locals.
