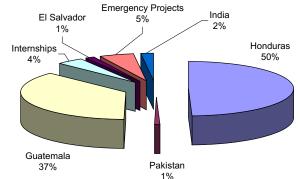

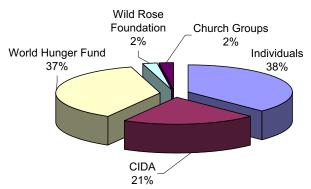

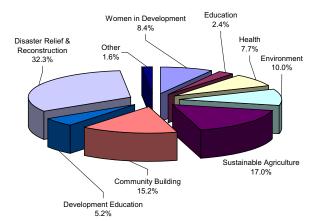




Total Income by Source

Executive Director's Message

What a year this has been. It used to be that World Accord would pass through a transition time that would reshape part of the agency or its activities every few years. Now the world situations are changing much faster. World Accord is being challenged in new ways every few months and those events reshape us. One could consider these as opportunities or as threats. World Accord looks for opportunities within the threats to peace and justice, hope and equality. Some of our activities can have a ripple effect.

Changes in global climate patterns are beginning to affect our project partners. The volume and the timing of rainfall has become more inconsistent. That makes it harder for farmers to know when to plant.

Climate change is also increasing the frequency and force of violent weather. World Accord is not a "disaster relief agency". World Accord is a long term development agency that supports sustainable change among communities of impoverished families in poorer nations. But when natural disasters strike our partners and stall or destroy their development project, World Accord can and does act to help restore the project and people to where they were before the disaster struck them.

This year our Partners were struck by hurricanes and earthquakes in Central America and Pakistan. Donors and the World Hunger Fund of the Community of Christ responded to our appeals with major grants to help people restore their lives in Pakistan and Guatemala to account for about one third of our funding this year. What was a large amount of money to us was small in comparison to the need. But even a small amount of assistance helps people know someone out there cares for them and encourages them. The ripple effect.

Another disaster looms on the horizon. It is the Asian Bird Flu. It is only a question of when it will arrive in the Americas. Chickens are the staple source of protein for all families in our Central American project areas. The established process to limit the spread of the disease is to slaughter all birds once the flu is found in the country. Protein deficiency is a major health threat especially to children. World Accord is working with partners to build up alternative animal and plant stocks as sources ready to fill a huge gap. Again, a small effort now will have the ripple effect of averting a major disaster later.

This is your World Accord. You make it possible for positive transformative change in the lives of thousands all around the world. We carry their message to you. THANK YOU! Our lives are better because you help us. THANK YOU!!

World Accord Construction Expeditions

Construction Expeditions are a volunteer led activity. Participants raise money to travel to one of our project areas in Central America and help local people with a building project. The local poor will get a house, school or water system. The participants get to help! In the process they learn of the issues facing our partners and have the opportunity to develop kinship bonds with many local people.

World Accord benefits by having more and more people each year who have been "in the field" and have a deeper sense of our cause. Last year 29 builders raised more than \$110,900 to help with construction projects in Honduras and Guatemala. Volunteers Al Wigood, Richard Kirsh and Jens Schoenrank are key to this program.
